



2016 NOFA Ranking Policy

Tier 1 Project Placement

- First time renewals will be listed in Tier 1.
- Transitional Housing projects that commit to a review from the CoC on conversion options prior to the 2017 NOFA will be placed in Tier 1.
- HMIS and Coordinated Entry Grants will be placed in Tier 1.

Renewal Projects

- Renewal projects are evaluated and scored with the 2016 Renewal Performance Evaluation Tool, which includes the System Performance Measures. Additional points are based on cost per client, project overview statement, 150% leverage, and responses to questions from the IRT, totaling 150 points.
- Consolidated grants will be scored based on past individual project performance proportional to the total budget awarded for the previous grants, consolidated into one overall score.

New Projects

- New projects will be scored on a 100-point scale.
- Reallocated projects will automatically receive 50 additional points to compete with renewal projects on the 150-point scale.

Additional Ranking Policies

- Projects with equal scores are ranked by project component type.
- Projects with equal scores and the same component type will be ranked based on cost per client.
